Wolves Women, an integral part of the Wolverhampton Wanderers family, are a National League Northern Premier Division team managed by Dan McNamara.

Having topped the Division 1 Midlands league table during a pair of Covid-19 affected seasons (having only lost one league game in two years), Wolves finally earned promotion in 2021 via upward movement, and have the longer term aim to return to the upper echelons of the women's game.

With that ambition firmly in mind, the women's and girls' section is benefiting from the solid support of their parent club and a combined academy, sharing facilities at the Compton Park training ground, including sports science, analysis and physiotherapy.

Rugby Borough Women's First Team compete in the Women's National League South which is the highly competitive third tier, managed by Lee Burch.

The players are semi-professional with the aim of being promoted back into the championship and returning to being full time. The women's team renamed as Rugby Borough in May 2023 from Coventry United Ladies FC. The change occurred due to the women's team at Coventry not having a place to call home - instead they played at Butts Park Arena, home of Coventry Rugby. Welcomed with open arms, Rugby Borough was the perfect fit.

Rugby Borough finished 3rd in the League this year (2023/24), narrowly missing out on 2nd place.

BCFA were proudly accepted as participatory members of the UN's Sport for Climate Action Framework, the first County FA to do so, using the power of sport to normalise conversations, promote athlete advocacy at all levels, share best practice and implement innovative solutions to combat the increasing threat and negative impact of climate change on the beautiful game.

Project Lead Richard Lindsay says of the programme "Climate change is arguably the greatest challenge of our generation. While grassroots football is not the cause; most clubs are SME sized, often loss-making, volunteer led enterprises with a microscale carbon footprint, we know there is an appetite for change with 86% of BCFA clubs believing the game should do more to reduce its environmental impact.

Save Today, Play Tomorrow offers huge potential for engagement, as the scale on which people share a close affinity with their community club is perhaps unparalleled in any other sport".
