Recreational football	1	Providers of Cambridgeshire FA affiliated recreational football/partners (walking, 50+, flexi groups).
Coaching (adult game*) The representative must be a qualified coach (level 1 minimum).	1	Nominated and voted by adult clubs and adult coaches within Cambridgeshire FA affiliated clubs.
Education	1	Education partners/ organisations/ providers.







Roles of council member

• Council members represent football in Cambridgeshire and contribute by providing first-hand knowledge and experience to help to inform plans, priorities and programmes. Representatives will be expected to put forward the views of the participants they represent and conversely keep them informed of the association's views and activities, subject to confidentiality issues. Although representatives are appointed or elected by members within their category, they should be aware that council membership means that they will be expected to assist in the association's administration of football for the benefit of all participants within the county.







Benefits

Get involved, leave your mark and be proud of your football community.

Help your football community to achieve their ambitions, such as:

- ✓ Raising standards across the game;
- Creating positive match day environments;
- Establishing player pathways for continued participation, placing the player at the centre of all they do;
- Providing safe, fun and inclusive environments for all to experience and enjoy;
- Understanding the role they play in their football community;
- Becoming sustainable and financially efficient organisations.





Time Commitment

- 5 x council meetings plus the AGM (this is usually held before one of the council meetings) per year. Council meetings are usually held on a Monday or Thursday evening and last for approximately 1 hour.
- Attendance to support the running of cup finals -- ideally minimum 2 per season.







Time Commitment

- Attendance at relevant standing committee meetings. Standing committees usually meet 3 or 4 times per season. Committee meetings are usually held via Microsoft Teams on a Monday or Thursday evening and last for approximately 1 hour.
- Attendance to support club safeguarding compliance visits and or club support visits -- ideally minimum 2 per season.

*No member would be expected to sit on any more than one committee but could do so if they so wished.

Eligibility for nomination







The CFA welcomes nominations from all parts of the community for people who have the necessary skills and attributes to make a positive contribution to inclusive football.

- ✓ Candidates should be, or have been, involved in football within Cambridgeshire FA boundaries.
- ✓ Candidates should have knowledge of the category they would like to represent, and an interest in developing football within Cambridgeshire.
- ✓ Positions are open for nomination by affiliated clubs or partners relevant to the category (see Categories).
- ✓ Candidates should be known to the nominating club/partner but do not necessarily need to be a member.
- ✓ No club/partner may nominate more than one candidate.

Nomination process

People wishing to become a category representative must be nominated by an eligible member club or partner (see Categories for more information). By nominating someone you confirm they wish to stand. We will contact them to ask for a supporting statement from them to demonstrate their skills and experience to support.

On the nomination form you will be asked to provide a short statement (no more than 200 words) for the person being nominated. This should include how the person is involved within the category, and how they would represent the category positively. This will be used alongside the nominee's supporting statement in the event of an election to help the voters make their decision.

* Where there are more candidates than vacancies, members will be elected by a vote from the relevant clubs/partners.

Members will serve a fixed 3-year term of office and are eligible for re-election for a maximum of three terms.
