Following on from the presentations of these awards, we will present the Hampshire FA Certificate of Commendation to those individuals who have completed a further 10 years' service following the award of either a Hampshire FA Service to Football Award or Hampshire FA Referees Service to Football Award.

We then move on to the Hampshire FA Referee Awards which are decided by members of the Hampshire FA Referees' Committee in conjunction with myself and the Hampshire FA Referee Development Manager. These have been awarded for the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons combined as a result of reduced fixtures due to COVID-19 restrictions.

We will then recognise our local winners for The FA & McDonald's Grassroots Football Awards. These individuals and organisations were nominated by members of the grassroots football community and selected as our local winners for by the Hampshire FA Awards Panel meaning they have been put forward for consideration by The FA for a national Grassroots Football Award.

Hampshire FA Service to Football Award

2019-20 & 2020-21

A Service to Football Award is made for 25 years' continuous or aggregated voluntary service to the county and each winner is nominated by their local Divisional Football Association.

Recipients of this award for the 2019-20 season are:

Barrie Becheley

Barrie was originally enticed into the world of grassroots football by his colleagues. Now, 53 years' service later, Barrie is Chairman of Burridge AFC. His greatest achievement has been seeing the club win the Hampshire FA 2019 Charter Standard Adult Club of the Year Award. He hopes to continue his great work with the club into the future.

Colin Williams

Colin has very recently taken a step back from grassroots football but, prior to this, dedicated over 45 years to various grassroots management and secretarial roles with West End Youth FC (amalgamated with Hamble Club FC in 1975). Most latterly, Colin held the role of Club Secretary for Hamble Club FC and has enjoyed making great friends throughout his service to grassroots football. Although he's now taken a step back, for the future he is sure that he will not stray too far away from the game.

Geoff Ruck

Geoff serves grassroots football in a number of roles including Youth Team Coach, Club Secretary and Club Chairman for Brading Town FC, as well as chairman of the Isle of Wight Divisional FA. Having originally got involved in grassroots football by coaching his son's youth team, Geoff has enjoyed seeing young players grow and develop into confident people. Recipients of this award for the 2019-20 season are:

He originally got into refereeing when he was released as a player from Plymouth Argyle FC and has received lots of advice from senior referees along his refereeing journey, which he says has helped him to progress further. The ethos of the league has always been to encourage children of all abilities to take part in football. The league has won the Respect Award twice and is constantly working with clubs to improve all aspects of the Respect ethos. The league has also been running courses on "becoming a referee", which has led to over 30 parents and players taking up refereeing. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the league's COVID-19 Officer produced regular updates to clubs, these updates were sent to all other leagues by Hampshire FA as an example of best practise.

Steve Berry

Grassroots Grounds Team of the Year Award

Steve originally got involved in grassroots football when his daughter started playing. He is now a volunteer groundsman, always trying to improve his pitches and his practises. Steve is proud to have attended the national Groundsman of the Year Awards. He hopes to keep going with the work he is doing into the future.

Rising Star of the Year Award

Caitlin first started coaching football on a voluntary basis at the age of 14 with AFC Stoneham. She has since seen a new Wildcats Centre established at the club. Established in 2018, Southampton RTC exists to help bridge the gap between grassroots and academy football. Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, the club is extremely proud to have supported its players through three major lockdowns. The club commenced a project to keep a constant and frequent flow of activities and online meetings with players and parents, offering them a safety net throughout an incredibly worrying and difficult period, making a huge positive impact on their mental health and wellbeing. As grassroots football slowly returns back towards normal operation, the club is now looking forward to implementing new technologies out on the pitch that can advance their training and coaching practises.





Hawley FC

The Spirit of Grassroots Football Award

Established in 2004, Hawley FC strives to be the best grassroots football club it can be, allowing children in the local community to indulge in their passion in a fun and safe environment. Club President, Scott Mills, went on BBC Radio Five Live in December to talk about their work in the local community: the club rallied the local community together last autumn to provide packed lunches to children in the local area whose families were struggling financially due to the pandemic. Inspired by Marcus Rashford, they supplied 500 lunches to children made and delivered by volunteers and players at the club. The club then followed this up at Christmas time when they donated toys and food hampers to nearly 200 families in the community. It was a huge effort from club volunteers and players from our men's team, but also highly rewarding for all involved to help the local community in the true spirit of grassroots football.

Andy Deakin

Hampshire FA Special Recognition Award - Coach

When Andy's stepson's team required a manager, he stepped up and took on the role. He is proud to have been able to take a team of 6-year-olds and progress into their 7th season now. Throughout lockdown, Andy maintained regular contact with all players, setting them weekly challenges to help keep them fit and support their mental health. On top of this, he worked alongside a local charity, Abby's Heroes, and set the players a challenge to walk, run or cycle the distance to visit every Premier League ground (270 miles). In completing this challenge, the team raised £2500 for Abby's Heroes. Andy really enjoys making sure the players are happy and aims to continue his work with his current team right through to U16's... and then maybe even do it all over again with a new U7's team!

Brian Le Breton

Hampshire FA Special Recognition Award - Match Official

Brian has been a pivotal point of contact while the Hampshire FA Referee Development Manger was placed on furlough. During this time, he continued to work tirelessly behind the scenes, speaking to various individuals within the FA so that he could continue to support the referee workforce and the wider refereeing community. He continues to travel the length and breadth of the county, completing not only observations, but providing mentoring and referee support where needed, always striving to ensure that Hampshire FA referees are given the best opportunity to succeed.

Cledwyn Davies

Hampshire FA Special Recognition Award - Volunteer

Cledwyn first got involved in grassroots football as a player in Wales in the 1970's before serving as a Committee Member for Aberystwyth & District Football League, Mid-Wales Football League and the Central Wales FA. He also took on roles as Club Coach and Secretary for Porton Sports Junior FC. In 2001, he was invited to join the Testway Youth Football League Committee as Vice Chairman; a role that he continues to fulfil today. As a retired Senior Scientist for Public Health England, Cledwyn also assumed the role of COVID-19 Officer for the League and was instrumental in the League's production of regular COVID-19 updates that helped support clubs and players throughout the pandemic. Cledwyn enjoys giving young players of all ages the opportunity to play football in a safe environment and hopes to continue to help offer this so that they can flourish and enjoy the game that he loved throughout his youth.

Eastleigh & District Mini Soccer League

Hampshire FA Special Recognition Award - League

Eastleigh & District Mini Soccer League was established in 1999 with 51 teams. Now with 271 teams from 51 Clubs, it provides league football for over 2500 children at central venues in the Eastleigh area. As one of the first 'Respect Leagues', piloting block registration, early take up of the Whole Game System, and the Matchday app, the League is at the forefront of Mini Soccer development in the County. The League's proudest achievement is completion of its development plan to move 85% of all match play to 3G artificial surfaces to give their youngest players the best surface to play on and to reduce the huge amount of lost match time due to the British weather. Stoneham Lane Football Complex is now the league's main home and during the COVID-19 pandemic, the league delivered a high quality COVID-19 risk assessment to safeguard players, officials, spectators and Hampshire FA staff, ultimately helping to keep Stoneham Lane Football Complex open, safe and COVID-19 compliant. Some of the measures included, marshalling exit and entrance areas to ensure social distancing was observed, staggering kick-off times to ease congestion and allow teams to enter and exit safely, restrictions on number of spectators per player months before it was part of The FA requirements at Stage 2, and also the wearing of face masks for spectators whilst pitchside.

Yateley United FC

Hampshire FA Special Recognition Award - Club

Yateley United FC was established in 1902 for men's football. In 1967, Yateley Juniors FC was formed. In 2009, four local football clubs began discussions on joining together to form a single ambitious club which could build the necessary structure and facilities to provide a good standard of association football for the local community. From these discussions, the clubs of Yateley FC and Yateley Juniors FC came together under the Yateley United FC name, with Yateley Green AFC and Beaulieu FC joining the structure of Yateley United FC in 2013. In that same year, the club purchased the freehold of 7.2 hectares of Sean Devereux Park. This and the subsequent and ongoing development of the park, including a new clubhouse, was made possible due to the work of volunteers, and fundraising from the highly successful local music festival 'Gig on the Green, Yateley'. With the lockdown declared in March 2020 a number of the club's members, working with Hart Voluntary Action, were actively involved in the management and provision of supplying shopping services and personal support to those shielding. Subsequently, because of this work the club was invited by Hart Voluntary Action to help create and manage the marshalling of the Vaccination sessions. Almost every week since December Yateley United FC members have completed hundreds of hours of voluntary work ensuring the all-important jabs can be delivered to the local community and they continue to do so.

Also in this category, we would like to present the Hampshire FA Community Trust Special Award. This award is to recognise an individual, club, league or organisation that has gone above and beyond to improve the three pillars of the Hampshire FA Community Trust throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The three pillars are: Disability Football, Equality & Inclusion and Community Coaching.

David Parsons

Hampshire FA Community Trust Special Award

Having initially gotten involved in grassroots football as a parent, David is now Team Manager and Secretary of Hamble Pan Disability. David enjoys helping children and adults progress in football, seeing them having fun in a non-judgmental environment and giving them memories to last a lifetime. Throughout lockdown, he has seen a huge influx of players and has grown the number of teams from two to eight! He now looks to try and further increase the opportunities that he and the club can provide by setting up a wheelchair football team.

The recipients of this award are:

Bournemouth Divisional FA & Bournemouth Football League

For their Centenary in 2020

The Bournemouth Divisional FA was founded in 1920 by William Pickford, the first President of the Bournemouth Divisional FA between 1920 and 1922 who also went on to become a Vice-President of FIFA and eventually President of The FA in 1937. For over 100 years now, Bournemouth Divisional FA has facilitated and supported grassroots football operating a number of league and cup competitions over the years. Based at Hurn Bridge in Christchurch, the Bournemouth Divisional FA runs the Bournemouth Saturday Senior Cup, as well as two divisions and three cup competitions on Saturday's, and six divisions and five cup competitions on Sunday.

Brading Town FC

For their 150th Anniversary

Brading Town FC was formed in 1871 to provide football for local people. Throughout their 150 years, the club has been an integral part of the community. During that time, the club has won the Isle of Wight Gold Cup and the Hampshire FA Intermediate Cup (now the Hampshire FA Trophy) most recently in June this year. The club now looks to continue offering participation opportunities for all in the local area, including a recent increase in female participation. They aim to do this by providing excellent facilities for people of all abilities and backgrounds.





Solent University

For outstanding media support of the Hampshire FA Men's and the Women's Senior Cup Final in 2020/21

Solent has been a university since 2005 and since helped nearly 50,000 students, from all walks of life, make the most of their potential. Students from the following courses, led by Technician Instructor, Matthew Hickling, and Lecturer, David Reilly, have provided Hampshire FA with outstanding media support, streaming both the Men's and Women's Senior Cup Finals live on YouTube:

- BA (Hons) Television Production
- BSc (Hons) Film & Television Production Technology (now replaced with BSc (Hons) Live Event Technology)
- BA (Hons) Sports Journalism
- MA Sports Broadcast Journalism

Streaming has utilised the university's custom-built outside broadcast vehicle, as well as custom fly-away systems rigged from scratch. Services for the finals included: professional ENG camera systems, commentary feeds, pitch-side interviews, VT and sponsor messages, sports graphics, slow-motion replay and multichannel audio mix. These events push the students to work to their best both technically and in terms of organisation and teamwork. The faculty now seeks to build on their live stream offering to make it even more professional, while also looking to strengthen ties with local sports clubs.

Toynbee School

For being joint winners of the English Schools FA National Cup (Year 7) in 2019/20

The Toynbee School's ethos of 'personal best' is paramount to the work of the PE department. They aim to develop students' knowledge and understanding, as well as quality of performance, across a wide range of activities with the key theme of improving fitness levels ever present. The school is extremely proud to have been named joint winners of this prestigious competition; the second time that they have won an English Schools FA Cup, having also won it with their under 14's girls in 2008. The school will now continue to develop football for all children and see what their league and cup commitments at district, county and national levels bring them.

United Services Portsmouth FC

For reaching the FA Vase Semi Finals in 2020/21

Formerly Portsmouth Royal Navy FC, the club was founded by Dennis Probee in 1962 with the intention of providing competitive football for all serving Navy players by bridging the gap between Services Football and Royal Navy Representative football. The club played in the Hampshire League from its formation until 1985/86 when they became one of the founder members of the Wessex League. Since then, the club's Burnaby Road Sports Complex has evolved with Victory Stadium the centre piece, boasting a 500 seated covered stand, adjacent are 3G pitches for Football, Hockey & Rugby. In 2002, the club introduced a youth section which has become one of the strongest Mini-Soccer & Youth Clubs in Hampshire, achieving FA Youth Charted Standard in 2014. The 2004/05 season saw Portsmouth Royal Navy FC re-elected to the Wessex League & renamed United Services Portsmouth FC. Reaching the semi-finals of the FA Vase in the 2020/21 season was a momentous achievement for an amateur football club and they now aim to maintain this level of performance in the coming months.

The FA Long Service Award (50 Years)
