"Results/performances so far

To be fair, we've had some standout performances this season, whereas you may pick up maybe 2 a year, we have so far picked up 4 top top performances and got results from them, Romulus A 1-4 (Changed system and got great rewards), Hfd A 1-3 different style again reaped rewards, S Khalsa A again another 0-4 win and a stunning second half display but probably standout result and performance came away at local rivals Worcester City where we went in at half time 0-5 to the good and finished game with a 1-6 win

"We made a good start to the season with some pleasing performances and with us picking up maximum points in the first three games and also not conceding a goal.

We are still involved in two cup competitions in the WMRL premier Cup and the HFA County Cup; we are hoping to get to the final of both of these competitions, the county cup for the third year in a row. In our second season playing in the FA Vase we reached the second round only to be knocked out away at AFC Hinckley, after two good results in previous round's against Coventry Copsewood and Paget Rangers. We thought we should have beaten Hinckley but again poor finishing and individual mistakes cost us. In the League cup we put in a superb performance in beating an inform Bilston team away 5-3 having gone down to 10 men in the first half, in the next round we have been drawn at home to play Bewdley Town. In the HFA County Cup we had a bye in the first round and came out 3-1 winners away in a difficult encounter against a strong Malvern Town reserves side in the second round, in the ¼ final draw we have drawn Bartestree away.

Like most teams we haven't really been able to have a settled side mainly due to availability through work, injuries or suspensions. We have had our usual stalwarts in club captain and goalkeeper Steven Bell, forward Kiea Cowley-Hair, midfielders Kalum Wildig & Tom Dawson and also the centre half partnership of Jamie Cuthbertson & Liam Jones available for most of our games which is basically the spine of our team and important to how we play. Young wingers James Hancocks & Ashley Lear have played important roles this season along with Tom Harding up front & James Fennessy & Jordan Williamson in the fullback berths, Gareth Bowley has started to pick up some form and vying for that fullback position and with Zac Sirrell & Rory Worthing now unavailable Alex Lancett & Brad Williams have played their way into the starting eleven.





Brad unfortunately has picked up a nasty injury along with Jake Robinson who had a good start to the season, Chris Gwynne, Jamie Bell, Jordan Moon, Cameron Godsall, Curt Green & Jordan Burke have come in and played their part when required or available. Adam Hockey has come back in from Hereford Fc on dual registration & has been in great form but unfortunately has picked up a hamstring injury.

At the moment we are in 8th place in the league and hope to at least finish in the top 5 and to make two cup finals but we will need to have all these players available, this is probably the smallest squad we have assembled over the last few years and so important not to pick up any more injuries or suspensions."




Wayne Whitbread Clee Hill United


