Competition History

This is the 18th Final of the Hertfordshire FA Under 16 Girls Challenge Cup



The Hertfordshire FA Under 16 Girls Challenge Cup was introduced in the 1997-98 season, reflecting the growth in girls playing across the county. This was the first time there had been County Cups specifically for girls in Hertfordshire and was introduced alongside an Under 14 competition. Cups for the 'odd' age groups would follow in 2005-06.

The early years of the competition were dominated by Bushey Rangers, who won four of the first five titles and they remain the club that has won this trophy most times. There then followed a number of years when there were not enough teams for a viable competition. This reflects the fact that while the younger age groups thrived as female participation grew, there remained a challenge in keeping girls involved in the game through to adult.

More recently this situation has improved significantly and the competition has flourished, with an Under 18 Girls County Cup competition also being added in Hertfordshire for the first time last year. Although Hitchin Belles have previously enjoyed success in other age groups, both of today's clubs are appearing the final of this competition for the first time.

Today's match will be 40 minutes each way, with kicks from the penalty mark if necessary to decide the winner. Teams are permitted rolling substitutions from a list of 7 named players.

Recent Finals

The COVID pandemic caused the 2019-20 season to be cut short, with winning semi-finalists Stevenage Boro Juniors and Wodson Park declared to have shared the competition. The Under 16 Girls Cup was not run in the subsequent season before returning in 2022.

All girls club reaching its first County Cup Final after seven years of impressive growth

Starlets were founded in 2017 to give local girls the opportunity to play football in a fun and safe environment. While the game is changing, girls teams can sometimes feel like an afterthought in clubs focused on boys football. We didn't want our girls to feel second best, so we decided to start a club where their needs come first. A place where girls can feel comfortable and confident learning the game and enjoy developing their skills.

Having begun with just one team and twelve players, our approach turned out to be more popular than we could ever have expected and the club grew rapidly right from the start. Within five years we had grown to more than 175 players and the club had won several awards. Today we have fifteen teams offering football opportunities across all youth age groups and are proud to be recognised as an England Football Accredited Club.

Football is not only a fantastic way for children to improve their fitness and enhance their physical development, it can also be a way to learn vital life skills such as determination, discipline, resilience, and teamwork. As such we recognise that some of the most important lessons they will learn with us will help them not just on the pitch but in later life.

From developing a sense of fair play, to learning how to be humble in victory or gracious in defeat, football can have a significant positive impact on a child's personal development. So we think it's vital to create a culture where attitude is considered just as important as ability and our values (Integrity, Equality, Trust, Respect, Enjoyment, Teamwork, Loyalty and Sportsmanship) are lived in everything that we all do.

The club was founded by Roger Spicer in 1999 with the acknowledgement of Hitchin needing a girls football club. Within the first decade the club grew organically and quickly became one of the largest all female football clubs in the county.

At Hitchin Belles we aim to provide a caring, family environment where girls can develop their skills and enjoy football. Players are encouraged to challenge themselves, as we play competitive football with enjoyment and development at the forefront.

To continue our high standards it is crucial that all of our parents, carers, and supporters buy into the club's ethos, as they continue to positively represent Hitchin Belles.

Hitchin Belles has continued to thrive over the years to grow the female pathway. With a home ground at The Priory School we have expanded to over 450 registered players across 30 teams, making us one of the largest all female football clubs in England.

Created in the summer of 2023, the Hertfordshire FA Youth Council is a group of young leaders aged 16-24 which aims to inspire, empower, and provide a voice for all young people to influence change, and positively impact football in Hertfordshire.

The Youth Council has established five focus areas in support of Hertfordshire FA's wider strategy; Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, Women and Girls, Coaching, Refereeing, and Safeguarding. The Youth Council also assists in the organisation of the County Cup competitions as well as building its own social media presence on platforms.

Our Youth Councillors are paired with a member of Hertfordshire FA staff to be mentored and supported in their own development. This means that, while the whole Youth Council works collectively on a team project, each champion has the opportunity to pursue their own projects that they feel passionately about with the guidance of their mentor.
