NORFOLK UNDER 18'S LEAVE IT LATE IN CORNWALL

Norfolk won their first game of the season in the second round of The FA County Youth Cup on Saturday, beating Cornwall in extra time by four goals to three.



Norfolk started the game with desire to play well, outplaying their Cornish counterparts in the first few passages of play. Thanks to goals from James Bemrose and Lewis Johnson Norfolk lead 0-2 at Half Time.

Cornwall rallied in the Second Half and took the lead with 20 minutes left to play. This forced Norfolk to go forward and find another goal. With the tie in stoppage time, Jordan Forbes received the ball out wide and took on the Cornish full back, with the centre back coming across to cover Forbes was tripped, earning Norfolk a chance to save the game in the 93rd minute. Owen Murphy stepped up to take the spot kick and smashed it down the middle as the keeper dove to his right.

With just five minutes left of Extra-Time, Norfolk won a free kick on the edge of the Cornwall box. Ford took the free kick, which deflected off the wall and into a mix of players, resulting in a goalmouth scramble. Within the melee, the ball fell to Cottingham who managed to get it out of his feet quickly and connect well, striking a thunderous shot into the bottom corner of the goal.

What are the requirements for a Just Play Centre?

- The centres are for participants who are 16+
- You would need to have a lead coach who has a minimum of a level one and first aid certificate.
- Your lead coach must also be responsible for completing the online application to become a Just Play Centre
- Applications for the centres open on 13th November with a view to CFAs approving these in early December

WALKING FOOTBALL – REVISED LAWS OF THE GAME

The FA have released a revised version of the Laws of the Game for Walking Football. The key changes are as follows:

- A goal may not be scored directly from the kick off
- When the ball rises above the designated height restriction resulting from a save or block performed by a goalkeeper the goalkeeper gains possession of the ball and must restart play with a goal clearance
- The game will be played with all free kicks being indirect free kicks
- A height restriction must apply, which cannot be less than the height of the crossbar and not greater than two metres
- A player being sent off will result in a permanent reduction in the number of players on the team
- The referee will award an indirect free kick against any player who is not walking regardless of whether or not they are in possession or if they are within playing distance of the ball or not

New investment provided by The FA, and delivered by the Football Foundation, has been announced that will support the growth and maintenance of 70 teams in the area, which is expected to cater for 1,400 footballers in local leagues.
