- Encourage the players to Respect the opposition, referee and match officials
- Avoid criticising a player for making a mistake - mistakes are part of learning
- Never engage in, or tolerate, offensive, insulting, or abusive language or behaviour

I understand that if I do not follow the Code, any/all of the following actions may be taken by my club, County FA or The FA:

I may be:

- Issued with a verbal warning from a club or league official
- Required to meet with the club committee
- Obligated to undertake an FA education course
- Obligated to leave the match venue by the club
- Requested by the club not to attend future games
- Suspended or have my club membership removed
- Required to leave the club along with any dependents

In addition

 The FA/County FA could impose a fine and/or suspension on the club

Terry, who will celebrate his 69th birthday on June 1st, is a Level 5 referee. He is originally from the East End of London and then Harlow in Essex. He was Chairman of the Harlow Football League and Chairman of Harlow Referees' Society. Terry was on Tottenham Hotspur Academy team before a snapped Achilles put paid to his playing career. He has officiated on the Suffolk & Ipswich League and Essex Senior League this season.

ASSISTANT REFEREE: Mark Paget

Mark first qualified as a referee aged 14 in Colchester, and by the age of 21 had reached the old Class 1. He requalified in Suffolk in 2020 after almost four decades out of the game and now, as a 65-year-old living in Wortham, enjoys officiating in the Suffolk & Ipswich League and occasionally the Thurlow Nunn Youth League and the Eastern Junior Alliance, as a Level 5 referee.

ASSISTANT REFEREE: Tony Wickenden

Tony Wickenden, who is 57 and lives in Lowestoft, has been refereeing for 21 years.

He is a Level 5 in the men's game and has just received promotion this season in the women's game to W3. He officiates in the Lowestoft & District League, Eastern Region Women's Premier Division and Norfolk & Suffolk Women's League.

FOURTH OFFICIAL: Bob Bullamore

Bob is a 77-year-old from Ipswich who currently officiates on the Suffolk & Ipswich League. Highlights of Bob's 50-year career include being assistant referee on a Premier Cup Final, two Senior Cup Finals and a Mick McNeil Cup Final and refereeing an Ipswich Inter-Firm Cup Final.

REFEREE SUPPORT OFFICER: Rob Symonds

Rob, who is 72 and lives in Haverhill, has been a referee for 40 years. He has officiated on various leagues including the Football Combination, Conference, Eastern Counties and Essex & Suffolk Border Leagues. He is currently refereeing on the Cambridgeshire County League, as a Level 5. He has refereed both the Suffolk Premier Cup and Suffolk Junior Cup Finals.

KAIRON HINES - Kai is a dynamic, aggressive, box-to-box midfielder with the presence and ability to dominate the centre of the park. The General.

HARVEY ADDISON - Previous Bury Town Youth player. Known as the magician and has feet which would dazzle you. Big game player.

JOSHUA FARRELL - One of the most naturally-gifted players. Glides with the ball and on his day is unstoppable. Match winner.

ARTUR LESZCZYNSKI - Mercurial talent. Serial winner and the man everyone looks to. Top scorer and unbelievable player. Goals.

- To provide survivors with advice guidance and resources to aid the healing journey
- To campaign for legal and regulatory changes to improve safeguarding in sport

Our objectives are:

- To secure partnerships with clubs at all levels, in all sports
- To engage with survivors and signpost them to the appropriate professional support
- To engage with survivors within the Offside Trust Support Network
- · To support charitable helplines with specific focus on survivors in sport
- To change the law on child sexual abuse being exempt from 'Double Jeopardy'
- . To lobby for 'Mandatory Reporting' to be adopted in UK law
- To engage with political and judicial bodies to strengthen legal support for survivors

Since 2016, the Offside Trust has received the support of supporters, clubs, players and former professionals throughout the sporting world. We focus on all sports, not just football. We are grateful for the support that we are getting from everyone including the people in cricket, rugby, golf and boxing, helping to raise further awareness across sport.

The Offside Trust works alongside governing bodies, charities and organisations that deal with safeguarding.

If you are a survivor of child sexual abuse in sport, there are a number of resources available. The FA have commissioned a dedicated NSPCC helpline for adults who were abused in childhood within the football industry from grassroots to Premier League.
