The third teams involved in the Finals will be the team of match officials. This is an occasion as much for them to enjoy as it is the teams. They have been selected to officiate these prestigious matches through merit, and whilst they may well make decisions which you don't agree with, they will make those decisions based on what they see/hear in a split second, without replays or slow motions. 
