
- A continued rise in misconduct charges has continued into the 2022/23 season.








Discipline Revenue




2022/23 Financial Snapshot


Executive Summary

- Surrey FA remains in a strong financial position, with Available Funds of £716k as at 30th June 2023 (£175k of which is being held in a Sinking Fund for future Meadowbank pitch replacement)
- 2022/23 saw a strong financial return, with Income for the year finishing +12% above Budget, primarily through additional grant funding distributed by The FA during the year, and better than planned income from our County Cup finals
- Income levels allowed £1.3m to beine ested back into the grassroots game in Surrey during the year, including enabling over 13.5k unique users at the Meadowbank stadium
- Net operating surplus (before HQ Rent) of c.£80k from running the Meadowbank football facility—the best return since taking occupation
- Team now focussed on continuing the positive growth into next season as we continue to execute against our 10yr strategy

Total Income +20% favourable vs. Prior Year, primarily as a result of increased grant funding and growth in income generated from the Meadowbank facility



£1.3m Invested into Running Football in Surrey in 2022/23







Future Outlook

- Stable financial position coming out of the 2022/23 season gives a strong platform for further growth into the 2023/24 season
- New investment opportunities continuously being explored to execute on 10yr Hub site strategy, ensuring excess cash reserves are fully utilised
- Ambitious targets in place for new commercial/sponsorship income across 2023/24 season, to offset expectation of flat central funding from The FA


