

THREE LIONS TO PLAY SWITZERLAND AT THE KING POWER STADIUM

England will go on the road this autumn to take on Switzerland in an international friendly at Leicester City's King Power Stadium.

The fixture takes place on Tuesday 11 September and will kick-off at 8pm. It is the second time the King Power Stadium has hosted the Three Lions, following a victory against Serbia and Montenegro in 2003.

Accessible Parking

To purchase accessible parking for this event you will need to supply proof of:

- *Enhanced Personal Independent Payment (PIP) for mobility; Standard or Enhanced PIP for daily living if they have been assessed under the PIP system, or*
- *Designated a member of the Support Group where assessed under the Employment & Support Allowance (ESA) scheme.*
- *Disability Living Allowance at Middle/Higher Rate, or*
 - *Attendance Allowance, or*
 - *Severe Disablement Allowance, or*
 - *War Disablement Pension, or*
 - *Blind Registration*
 - *CredAbility Access Card*
- *Any other documentation at the discretion of the Club*

Supporters will be able to purchase by calling Leicester City's sales centre on 0344 815 5000 (option 1) and also via tickets.lcfc.com. anyone with a disability will need to register first with us to purchase an access bay.

Q. What is the capacity at King Power Stadium?

Leicester City's King Power Stadium has a maximum capacity of 32,312.

Off the back of the success of England's last on-the-road match at Elland Road in Leeds on 7 June, the excitement of the Three Lions playing in the Midlands will no doubt draw a fantastic crowd.

Q. What are the best forms of transport to King Power Stadium?

TRAIN - Leicester Train Station is roughly 1.4 miles from King Power Stadium, which is approximately a five minute car journey or up to a 45 minute walk.

BUS - A number of bus services run from Leicester City Centre to King Power Stadium, stopping on Aylestone Road which is a five-minute walk from King Power Stadium. Most buses in Leicester are low floor vehicles, meaning they can be lowered to pavement level once the bus has stopped, and all include wheelchair spaces. CAR - The M1 and M69 Motorways interchange at Junction 21 (M1), where you should exit and follow the signs for the City Centre via the A5460. After 3 miles turn right onto Upperton Road, follow the road down until you get to the Liberty Statue Island and take the fifth exit down Western Boulevard and you will see King Power Stadium on your right-hand side.
