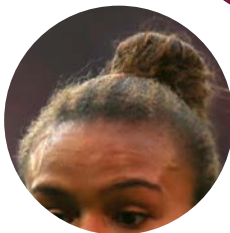

- 7 Thread the ribbon through the hole and tie a knot at the end.
- 8 Place it around your neck.

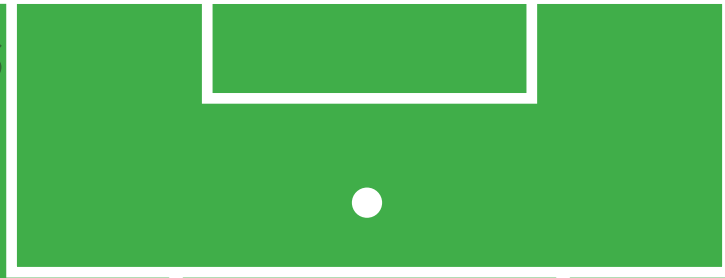

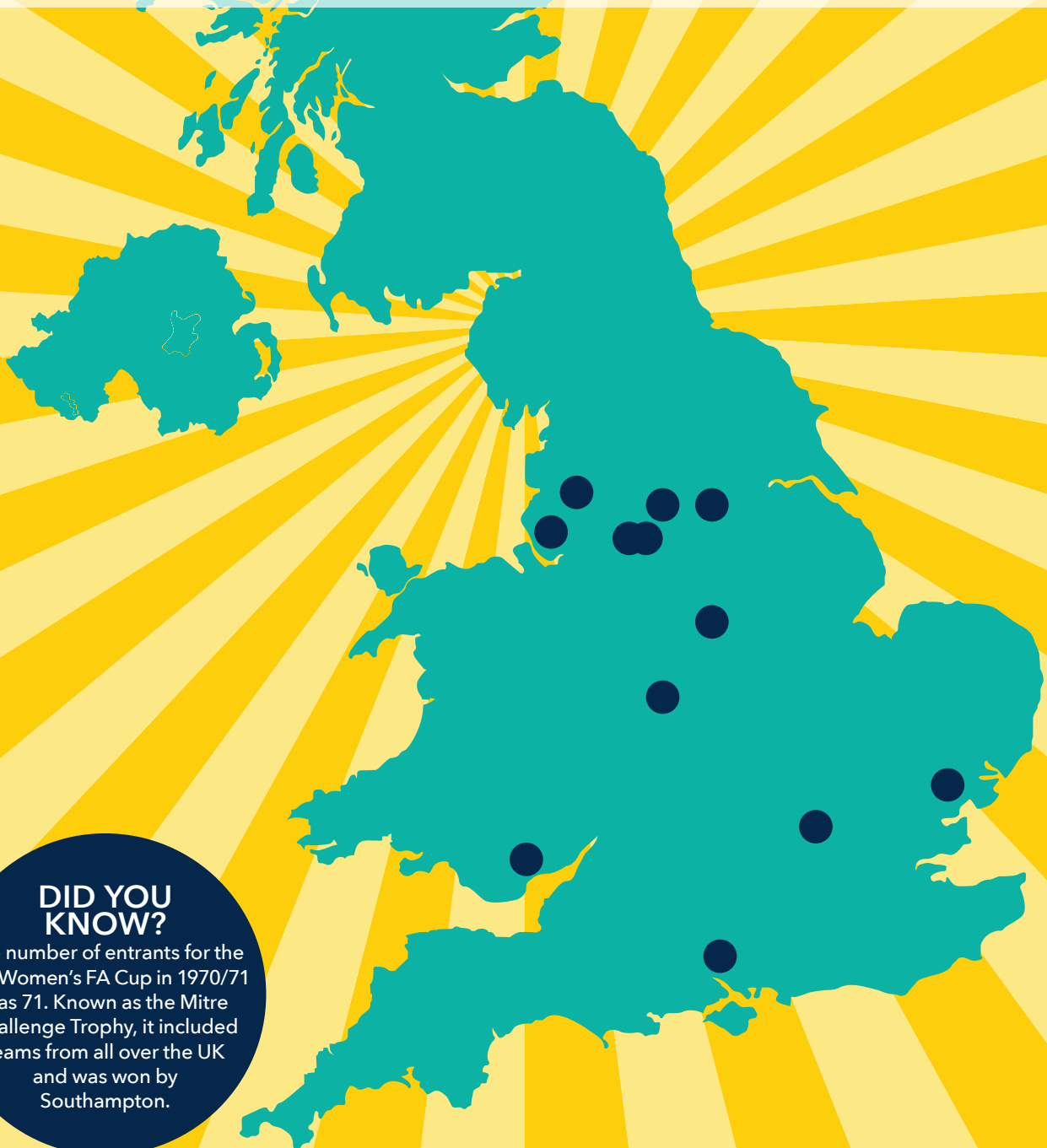

The number of entrants for the first Women's FA Cup in 1970/71 was 71. Known as the Mitre Challenge Trophy, it included teams from all over the UK and was won by Southampton.

MASTERS AT WORK

There are more people to the Emirates FA Cup Final than the 22 players out on the pitch. Here we meet three unsung heroes behind the scenes...

ANDY FRIEDLANDER MATCH DAY ANNOUNCER

"I've hosted 14 FA Cups now and am grateful to have the best seat in the house - just behind the designated away team. When the ball hits the back of the net, I quickly check to see if the ref has blown, to make sure we don't announce anything too early! I prefer that no-one scores in the first minute of the second half as otherwise I have to spit out a mouthful of food because that's the only chance I get to eat!"



KEVIN WILLIAMS MASTER SILVERSMITH, THOMAS LYTE, OFFICIAL ENGRAVERS

"We get to Wembley a couple of hours before kick-off. At half time, we go down to the room where everything is prepared and watch the second half on the screen. Even if we had the luxury of a team winning four-nil with 20 minutes to go, we wouldn't take anything for granted and start early. The only thing we put in is the date."



KARL STANDLEY HEAD GROUNDSMAN

"Our job is to make the stage work for the players. We start at seven in the morning of the Cup Final where we always hope for a sunny day so the pitch can shine. We'll double cut the pitch and get the white lines down. There's an excitement in the stadium even then because the TV crews are on the touchline. One time we did spray Gary Lineker when the sprinklers came on, but it was a complete accident!"

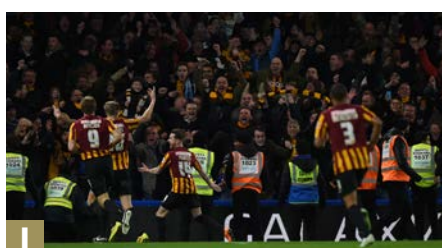

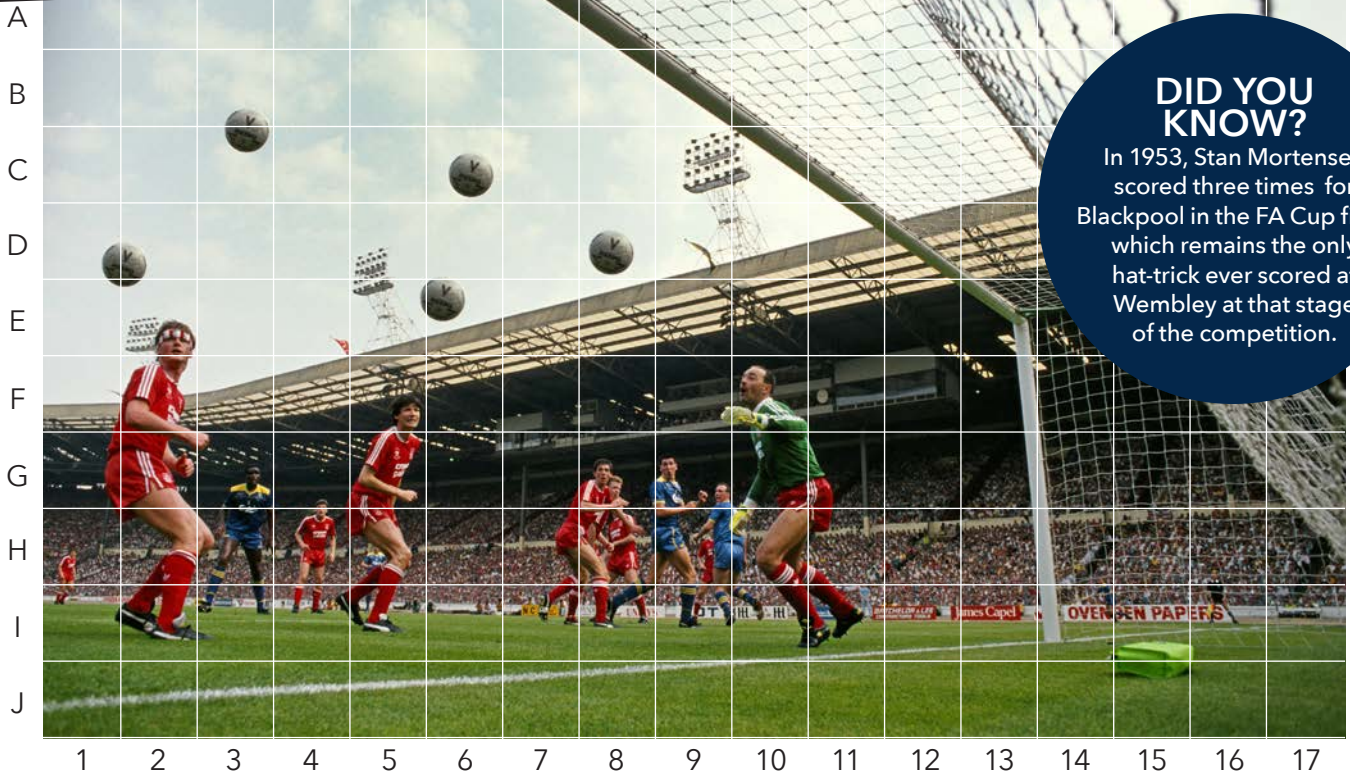

MY TOP FIVE FINALS

We asked former commentator and footie legend **John Motson** to pick his fave FA Cup Finals!



Chelsea 1-0 Manchester United / 2007

The first Cup Final at the new Wembley was always going to be special. We had two big clubs, and Didier Drogba popped up to win it for Chelsea.

Liverpool 3-3 West Ham United / 2006

What a fantastic game - and what a dramatic finish by Steven Gerrard. West Ham were so close to winning it and then Gerrard hit that 30-yard screamer. Remarkable!

Coventry City 3-2 Tottenham Hotspur / 1987

This is one of the best games of football I've ever seen in any Cup Final. There was some great play by both sides and some great goals, too.

Man City 2-3 Tottenham Hotspur / 1981 REPLAY

This match is high on any of my 'favourite' lists. It was such a memorable game and it was all about Ricky Villa. What a goal! And what a wonderful game to commentate on.

Liverpool 1-2 Manchester United / 1977

This was the first FA Cup Final I worked on so it was obviously a huge moment in my career. There was only one replay machine back then, from the same angle viewers had just seen, so I wasn't sure whether Lou Macari or Jimmy Greenhoff had scored the winner. Thankfully I called it correctly.

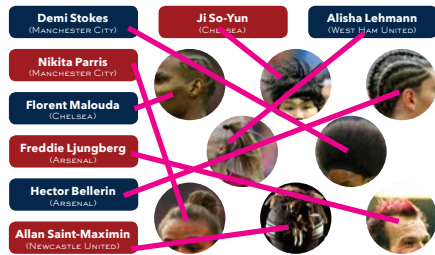

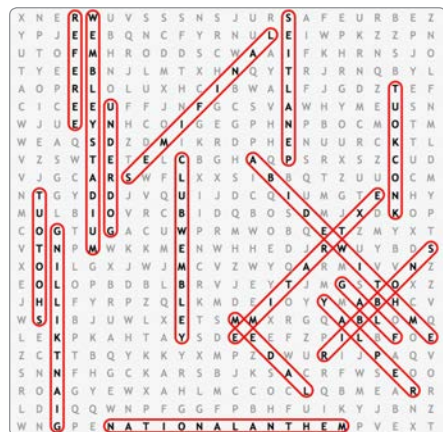

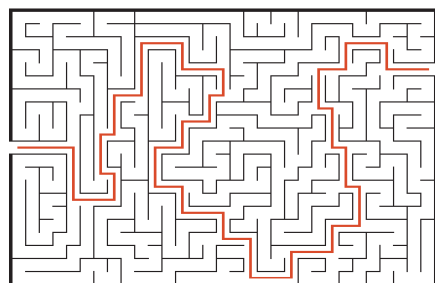
